In view of the fact that for the calendar year 1915 the average period of enrolment of 37,197 infants was but 104 days, this reduction of 50.9 per cent in the mortality rate may truly be described as remarkable. On the basis of an enrolment, in terms of infant-years, amounting to 10,663, and a saving per thousand infants enrolled of 42.84 lives, it would seem that as a result of the work done by the fifty-nine baby health stations operated by the city in 1915 approximately 457 lives of infants under one year of age were saved during the period of enrolment. This saving in lives meant a reduction in the mortality rate of the city of about 3.29 per thousand living births.1 1 Other life saving took place and other important benefits were conferred; see in this connection...
